Vegetation	plants considered collectively, especially those found in a particular area or habitat.
Historical	concerning history or past events.
Peak	the pointed top of a mountain.
Topographical	relating to the arrangement or accurate representation of the physical features of an area.
County	the principal subdivision of the country for political, administrative, judicial, and cultural purposes
Border	the edge or boundary of something.
Industry	economic activity concerned with the processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories.
Biodiversity	the variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable.

History of Derby

.Derby's Silk Mill is thought to have been the first factory in the world—and it was the first silk mill in England.

.Video game character Lara Croft was created in Derby at Core Design. There is even a road in Derby named after her.

.Derby is the birthplace of famous artist Joseph Wright (1734). Derby Museum has the largest collection of his paintings in the world.

.In 1976, Derby became twinned with the German city of Osnabruck. The idea of the twinning of these contrasting places has led to string friendship and trading links.

Physical Features within Derbyshire

River Derwent



Did you know?: It is 50 miles long and is a tributary of the River Trent, which it joins south of Derby

Mam Tor



Did you know?: Standing tall at 517m high, 'Mam Tor' means 'Mother Hill'.

Human Features within Derbyshire

Velodrome



Opened: 2015

Did you know?: The Velodrome was used as a mass vaccination centre during the Coronavirus pandemic.

Derby Cathedral



Opened: 1725

Did you know?: It has the second highest perpendicular church tower in England and its bells are the oldest set of 10 bells in the world.

Bolsover Castle



Did you know? It was built in the early 17th century and designed to be spectacular. The present castle lies on the earthwork and ruins of a 12th century medieval castle.

Rolls Royce Aerospace



Opened: 1906

Did you know?: Derby also has a Rolls Royce Nuclear site on Raynesway

Pride Park Stadium



Opened: 1997

Did you know?: Due to sponsorship, the venue was officially known as the iPro stadium between 2013 and 2016.

Chatsworth House



Did you know? The house is home to the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire and it has been in the family for 16 generations.



Derby County Football Club

Founded: 1884



History: The club was founded in 1884 by William Morley as an offshoot of Derby County Cricket Club. It is one of the 12 founder members of the football league in 1888 and is one of only 10 clubs to have competed in every season of the English football league system. They have a long-standing rivalry with nearby football club Nottingham Forest.
