Immigration	the action of coming to live permanently in a foreign country	Discrimination	being treated unfairly or unkindly based on race, age, beliefs or gender
Migration	seasonal movement of animals from one region to another.	Citizen	a legally recognised person living in a certain area.
Emigration	the act of leaving your own country to settle permanently in another; moving abroad.	Prosperity	something which is successful especially to do with money

Windrush Generation

Empire Windrush brought the first large group of postwar West Indian immigrants to the United Kingdom, carrying 492 passengers from Jamaica to London in 1948. Between 1948 and 1970, nearly half a million people left their homes in the West Indies to start a new life in the UK. Many Caribbean men and women had served in the British armed forces because, at the time, many West Indian islands were still under British rule (empire) and not yet independent. After the war, some of these people answered an advert to come to Britain where there were lots of different jobs to do.

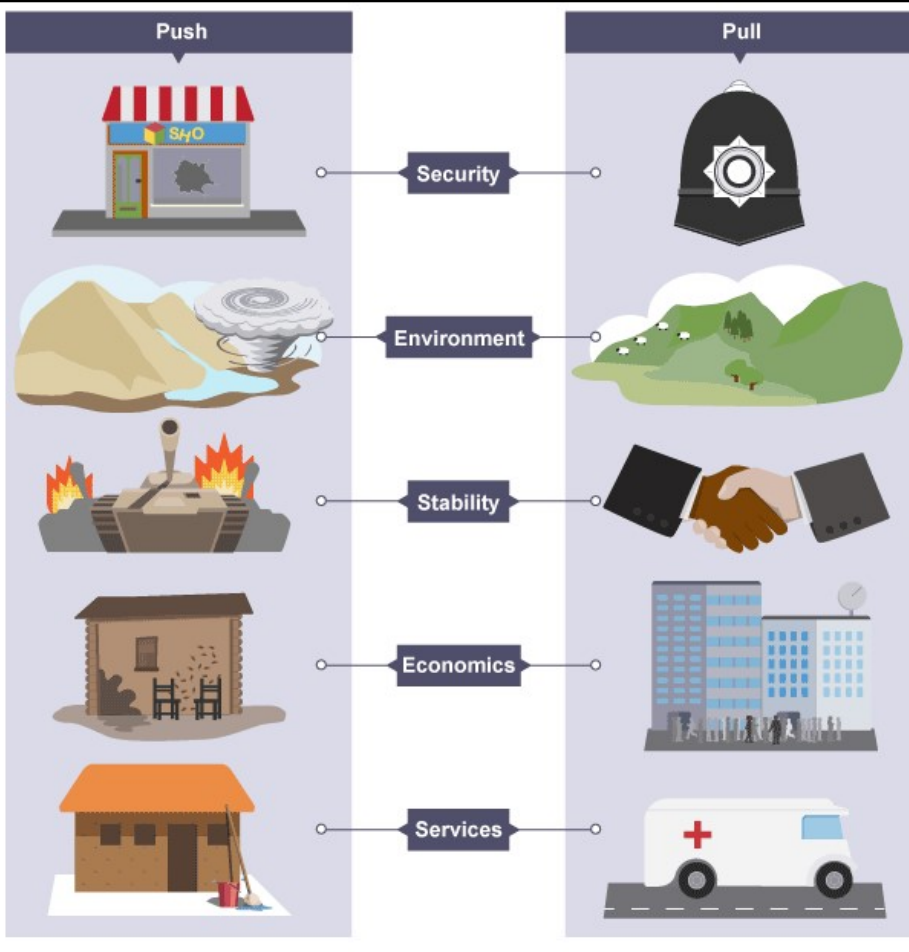


Push and Pull Factors of Migration

Migration usually happens as a result of a combination of these push and pull factors.

Push Factors are negative things that make people want to move to a new area e.g war or a family break-up.

Pull Factors are positive aspects that attract people to move to a place e.g good employment opportunities.



Barriers to migration

Migration movements are rarely smooth. People who are migrating have to negotiate a number of **barriers** when moving between countries. A number of obstacles can get in the way such as **legal restrictions, family attachments, and costs incurred** etc.
