Key Vocabulary

Olympics	International sporting events featuring summer and winter sports competitions.
Paralympics	A periodic series of international multi-sport events involving athletes with a range of disabilities.
Marathon	Inspired by the legend of an Ancient Greek messenger who raced from the site of Marathon to Athens, a distance of about 40km or nearly 25 miles.
Ancient	Belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence.
Continents	A large land mass separated from other land masses by oceans.
Nationality	The status of belonging to a particular nation (country).
Triathlon	An athletic contest consisting of three different events—Swimming, Cycling and Running.
Heptathlon	An athletic event in which each competitor takes part in the same prescribed seven events: high jump, shot put, 200m sprint, long jump, javelin throw and 100m hurdles.



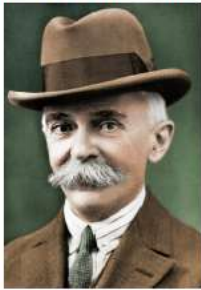

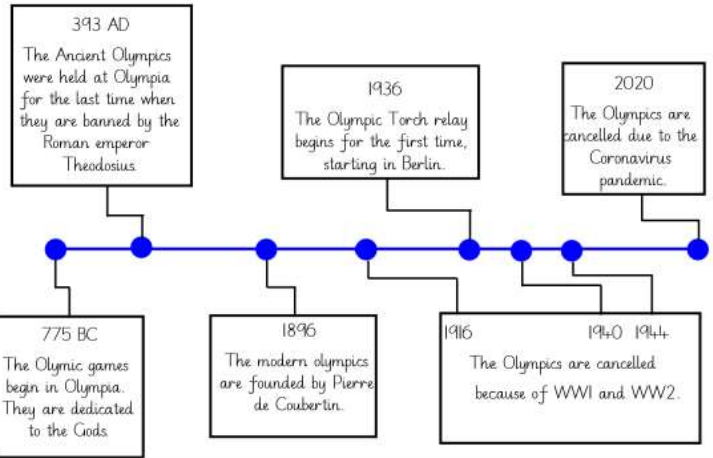

Sport: Wheelchair Racing

Paralympic Medals: 11 Gold, 4 Silver, 1 Bronze

Did you know?: Baroness Grey-Thompson still coaches her sport while working in the House of Lords!

Essential Knowledge

- The 5 Olympic Rings represent Africa, Asia, Oceania, Europe and the Americas, linked together in friendship.
- The Olympic Flame is lit at Olympia in Greece every 2 years before it journeys to the next host nation.
- The Olympic Flame lights the Olympic Cauldron. When this is lit, the Olympics officially start.
- The Olympics was/is held every 4 years as a tribute to the god, Zeus.
- Gold medals are actually made of silver! They have gold covering instead!
