At Cherry Tree Hill Primary School we plan to use this funding to: Action	Success Criteria
Increase participation by providing school PE kit for those who do not have their PE kit	All year groups to have spare PE and Games kits for those to use to be retained in school. School to achieve 100% participation. Kit for half term for children frequently not having kit and spare kit for children who forget their kit
Review the range of Out of School Hours Learning (OSHL), to target Pupil Premium pupils	All KS2 Pupil Premium children to be directly offered one OSHL activity, to be funded by the school
Extend Provision of OSHL, aiming to reach ALL pupils' interests	Pupil Survey of activities enjoyed and further ideas for provision, then plan activities accordingly
Extend lunchtime provision of activities	Target those year groups with less opportunity, for example Years 2 & 3
Further training for all Mid-day Supervisors to be play leaders and organise activities.	Training session to be attended by Midday supervisors and agreed activities established to include all year groups
Training for Year 6 pupils to become mini leaders.	Training for a group of Year 6 mini leaders who will then deliver structured play activities to rest of school during dinner.

Link PE with PSHE, Healthy Eating	School focus on Healthy Eating to be covered in school assembly and planned in to the Skills Curriculum. Healthy Schools Team to work and develop the NHS Sports Challenge

Involvement with Derby SSP	Provision of inter school competitions and CPD opportunities
PE Learning Walks to celebrate good practice and identify areas for development	All year groups to have feedback on quality of teaching and learning in PE
Develop teacher skills through whole school training, CPD and coaching	Whole school sessions on Gymnastics – SSP offering of planning for the new curriculum and planning for progression. Survey of staff needs. Signpost staff to SSP CPD opportunities.
Extend resources so that all pupils can be active in all lessons	Annual review of resources to ensure all children can access the curriculum and be active in all lessons. Year groups to identify resources required as needed.
Mini-tennis training for all staff	Staff to be trained in mini-tennis and use the equipment effectively in lessons
Increase numbers of children competing in inter-schools sports	Increase the number of inter-sports competitions attended from 4 to at least 6 in 2014/2015.
Each year to organise 2 intra-school events, in addition to Sports Day, so that ALL pupil participate in 2 events across the school year	All pupils to be involved in 2 intra-school sporting events in the school year. 1 x Intra year group competition 1x Competitive Sports Day
Establish further links with local clubs and signpost through fliers, visitors etc.	Establish further links to local netball, cricket, football, rugby, tri-golf, athletics, girls football
PE display in central place in school	PE display in school to celebrate the school PE vision, inform pupils, celebrate success, and signpost to local clubs

PE and Sport premium review for 2013-2014

Cherry Tree Hill Primary School had a very successful year with regards to PE and Sport Premium. Many of the aims which were proposed at the beginning of 2013 academic year were fully or partially achieved.

For example:

- Provision of breakfast/lunchtime and after school clubs has increased.
- Continued celebration of achievements within PE and Games is evident throughout the school.
- Participation of inter school competitions is increasing.

The revised action plan for the current academic year identifies some new areas for development but has also retained many of the original targets. We feel that although we have completed much of what we intended to achieve, we need to be continually monitoring, developing and challenging ourselves in these areas and so they remain on our action plan for 2014-2015.
